What is MLA Style?

MLA style is mostly used to write papers and cite sources in liberal arts and humanities. This handout is based on the MLA Handbook 8th Edition.

How do I format set up my paper in MLA Style?

- In the upper left-hand corner of the page, list your name, your instructor's name, the course title, and the date.
- All text should double-spaced, 12 point font (usually Times New Roman).
- Create a header with last name and page numbers in the upper right corner.
- Indent the first line of paragraphs one half-inch from the left (press the *Tab* button once).
- The title should be centered and the same size as the rest of the text, and every page should have **one inch margins**.

How do I create a works cited page in MLA Style?

- Title the page "Works Cited," and center the title.
- Enter your sources in **alphabetically by author's last name**. If no author is provided then alphabetize by the article's title.
- Make sure all of your sources have a hanging indent. To do this, highlight text and right click. Click Paragraph Settings in MS Word, or Format > Align & Indent > Indentation
 Options in Google Docs. Under Special, select Hanging from the drop down menu.
