He remembered that meeting, reached out to your staff, and we were able to get my son on board with it.

It changed him! He thrived! He loved the responsibility of being treated "like an adult" - to get to class, to turn assignments in, to handle the ins and outs of college life. He loved having teachers that were passionate & interested. He felt like he was learning & doing - not just given busy work. They invested in him & he felt it. The staff was constantly checking in with him, and all the students, to make sure they had everything they needed to succeed - from school supplies to breakfast to a friendly smile and word of encouragement. He made friends and found his self-confidence that had been missing since he had to give up the sports he

loved (due to an injury).

So thank you and thank you to all of OTC Middle College for what you are doing! Your program IS making a difference and I'm so thankful that it was available for Ben. If you ever have people that are on the fence about the program, I would be more than happy to talk to them!

As I read this, I wondered where this young man would be today had it not been for the Middle College. And what if OTC didn't exist at all? I have no doubt that similar stories play out hundreds of times each year across the OTC system. How fortunate we are to do such meaningful work with a purpose. We are changing families, our communities, and our world every single day.
