Administrative Withdrawal Follow Up

A work group has since been formed and will hold its first meeting later this month. I anticipate that work on this initiative will continue throughout the summer, but I hope to make substantial progress toward a plan before I retire on June 30.

Faculty Salary Study

Thank you to everyone who attended last Thursday's meeting with Lockton, where they presented the results of their full-time faculty salary study. I also shared the college's planned next steps: approximately 90 full-time faculty members will receive salary increases beyond the 3% across-the-board raise being recommended to the Board of Trustees. Additionally, the faculty salary chart has been updated with increased salary levels and a streamlined structure, combining all master's and master's + attainment levels into one category. If you are among those receiving a salary increase above 3%, you will be notified within the next two weeks.

As we approach graduation season, I want to share an email that Greg French, department chair of Social Sciences, recently received. Greg is coordinating this summer's Study Abroad trip to Greece (thank you, Greg!), and one of the student travelers – a culinary student – was awarded a scholarship through the travel group.
