Our business partners made it clear that they value individuals who aren't afraid to fail, as long as they're learning from it. Not every experience in life, school, or work will go as planned and that's okay. The real growth happens when students can reflect, adjust, and try again.

The CEOs also spoke about the importance of "holding the line" when it comes to expectations for students, both in their academics and professional behaviors. That message challenges us to think deeply about our roles. How do we create an environment that holds students accountable for their actions and decisions, yet still allows them the space to fail and learn? And how do we support them through those experiences so that failure leads to growth rather than a reason to quit?

I also appreciated the CEOs talking about grit and curiosity. Grit being that determination and perseverance to keep going even when things get tough. Curiosity being the spark that drives students to dig deeper and want to learn more. How can we create classroom and campus environments that nurture both? Finding ways to do this will not only strengthen our students but also benefit their future employers in meaningful ways.
