Disability Support Services

What is **Disability Support** Services?

Disability Support Services (DSS) provides accommodation services for students who have a diagnosed disability which substantially limits one or more major life activity.

Available Services

- Testing accommodations
- Individualized academic advising
- Coordination of needed classroom accommodations
- Coordination of interpreters, readers, writers, and
- Provision/coordination of assistive technology
- Consultation with faculty and staff regarding accommodation needs
- Liaison with community professionals and agencies
- Transition to college activities, including assistance with navigating the enrollment process
- Resources for students receiving disability support
- Information and referrals for students who suspect they have a disability
- Resources for veterans with disabilities

Who qualifies for these services?

Students with diagnosed disabilities including, but not limited to:

- Learning disabilities
- Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD/ADHD)
- Depression anxiety or other psychological disabilities
- **Autism-Spectrum Disorders**
- Health disabilities
- Physical/mobility disabilities
- Visual impairments-blind/partial sight
- Deaf/hard of hearing
- Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder
- Temporary disabilities

Supporting Documentation

To qualify for services, you must provide documentation that identifies the disability. There are multiple ways to provide DSS with documentation of your disability. Documentation should provide proof of diagnosis and/or prior accommodations.

Students should submit at least one of the following:

- IEP/504 plan
- Full evaluation/diagnostic report
- Accommodation letter from previous postsecondary institution
- Medical records/patient portal diagnostic summary
- Letter from a healthcare professional, on letterhead, which confirms a diagnosis



















Possible Accommodations

Accommodations ensure equal access to academic and other classroom information and activities. You will work with a DSS professional in determining the most appropriate accommodation(s) for your individualized needs.

Examples of accommodation services offered through Disability Support Services include, but are not limited to:

- Extended time on exams and quizzes
- Exams/quizzes read aloud
- Textbooks in alternative format (digital, enlarged, text-to-speech)
- Access to PowerPoint/Presentation/Lecture notes
- Opportunity to digitally record lectures
- Sign Language interpreters
- Assistive technology devices and services
