Dental Hygiene Application Checklist Updated 11/1/21

APPLICATION DEADLINE:

- **May 31** - This cohort begins in the fall semester (August)
- **Location:** OTC Springfield Campus, 1001 E. Chestnut Exp., Springfield, MO

The Dental Hygiene Program is a selective admission program and admission is determined by a points-based system. Points are awarded on the grades made in the preadmission classes, completion of clinical observations hours or CDA experience, Bennett, Wonderlic and Pegboard test scores, cumulative GPA on all courses completed, and residency status. An incomplete file will not be considered – Complete the following by the application deadline

- Complete OTC admissions process.
- *Complete the preadmission required courses.
- Request to have all official transcripts mailed to OTC. If classes were completed at OTC, a transcript is not required.
- All preadmission requirements must be completed by the application deadline (May 31).**
- **Complete testing early and by the application deadline (May 31). **Registration is required through Testing Services!** Click [here](#) for registration and information.
- Submit Dental Hygiene application to the Health Sciences office **by the application deadline (May 31)**. Instructions are on the [form](#). **Incomplete files will not be considered.**
- If applicant is a current CDA with at least 3 years' experience, submit a completed Work Experience Statement [form](#) **by the application deadline (May 31)**. **CDA must have been active throughout length of employment.**
- A copy of the CDA certificate for each year must be included with the Work Experience Statement.
- If applicant is **not** a current CDA, complete 24 hours of clinical observation/job shadowing **by the application deadline (May 31)**. The clinical observation form to be used for documentation may be found [here](#).
- The TOEFL is required by student if English is not student's primary language. Additional information below. Results are due by the application deadline.

GRADES/GPA

*A GPA less than 2.5, will not be given points as outlined on the Candidate Selection form.

*Complete preadmission courses with a grade of "C" or higher for points as outlined in the Candidate Selection form.

*The cumulative GPA score includes all courses completed at accredited institutions transferred to OTC.

TESTING - **Test early – appointments fill up quickly at Testing Services.**

**Student may take the Bennett, the Wonderlic, and the Peg Board testing twice in an application cycle. (June 1 – May 31).

**Schedule and complete through Testing Services at OTC.

- **Test results are due by the application deadline.
- **Results are known immediately. Testing Services will deliver test results to the Health Sciences office.
- **If student is reapplying, new test results will be required by the application deadline.
- **Test results expire 2 years from date of testing.
- **Tests taken for the Dental Assisting application cycle may be used if they haven't expired.

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENT:

Students whose primary language is not English must document their English language proficiency. This requires:

- ❖ Minimum **TOEFL iBT** passing score of 84, with a minimum speaking score of 26.
- ❖ Student must satisfy this requirement by submitting a current TOEFL iBT score (Test of English as a Foreign Language) **by the application deadline**.
- ❖ Testing is completed through the [TOEFL](#) website.
- ❖ The TOEFL report scores are valid for 2 years from the test date.
- ❖ This is separate from the test taken to be admitted to OTC.
- ❖ Results must be emailed to healthsciences@otc.edu by the application deadline.

NOTIFICATION OF ACCEPTANCE:

- Based upon the program's admission scoring system, the top 20 applicants are offered a position in the program and will receive information on the necessary steps to complete the program admission.
- In the event of a tie in final points, the student's cumulative GPA will be used in the selection process.
- Letters are mailed and emailed (to OTC account) to the address on the application, by USPS, indicating acceptance or non-acceptance into the program.
- The accepted students will receive an acceptance packet through their OTC email account to complete the admission process.

REAPPLICATION:

- Applicants and alternates not selected for admission must notify the Health Sciences Office, if they wish to pursue admission into the program the following application cycle.
- Applications must be renewed annually.
- Inactive application files will be shredded after 12 months.
