Student Admission Scoring Guide

Admission/Acceptance is based on a competitive scoring rubric. The rubric contains the following:

- Grade for BCS 165/145
- Grade for BCS 205/146
- Grade for BCS 200
- Grade for CHM 101
- Grade for MTH 128 or higher
 - In all of the above, a grade of “A” will receive more points than a “B” and a “C” will receive less than a “B”
 - Students must have a grade of “C” in all prerequisite courses
 - MTH 110 will be accepted until August 2020 cohort start
 - If you have taken BCS 120, BCS 145, BCS 146, HST 120 or MTH 110 prior to the FA 18 semester, please contact Allied Health Admissions (alliedhealthadmissions@otc.edu) for possible course substitutions.
- Cumulative Grade Point
 - Cumulative GPA, including courses from accredited institutions, transferred to OTC are considered in the scoring process.
 - Points start at 2.5 GPA. No points awarded for cumulative grade point average below 2.5.
- Completion of general education courses with a grade of “C” or higher by the application deadline.
 - Students are awarded 1 point per course completed by the application deadline.
 - Students are not awarded points for courses not completed by the application deadline.
- HESI LPN-ADN Entrance Exam
 - The minimum score on this exam is 850.
 - Points are awarded with the lowest number given for an 850.
- **Adult Health Kaplan (Only taken if the student is a current OTC PN student)**
 - This is taken while still in the OTC PN program
 - This will get the student contingent admission to the program.
 - The minimum score on this exam is 67.1.
 - The student’s “final acceptance” into the program will be based on the HESI LPN-ADN Entrance exam score. This score will be used to calculate final admission point total and admission rank for “final acceptance” into the ASN program.

Advising a student who is not a current OTC PN student.

These students need to be advised to take the pre-requisites first. Many of these students may have come from a vocational school where college level courses are not required. The courses that they take within these certificate programs do not transfer as college level courses. If they need to take additional courses to become full-time students, the courses below are the best choices.
