APPLICATION DEADLINES:

- July 3rd
 - Program offered at Table Rock Campus
 - Program classes begin in the fall semester

- November 3rd
 - Program offered at Springfield Campus
 - Program classes begin in the spring semester

The Paramedic Program is a selective admission program and admission is determined by a points-based system. Points are awarded on the Fisdap exam, academic performance, EMT work experience, and references. An incomplete file will not be considered – Complete the following by the application deadline

- Complete the OTC admissions process. Visit www.otc.edu/start-here

- Complete the preadmission required courses. Review the Preferred Course Sequence located [here](#). Official transcripts from accredited schools attended other than OTC must be received by the application deadline.
- Submit 3 professional references **by the application deadline**. The form may be found [here](#).
- Schedule Fisdap testing by emailing paramedic@otc.edu
- Fisdap information is found on the Admission Information [here](#): **Testing must be completed by the application deadline.**
- Submit a completed application for the Paramedic Program to the Allied Health office **by the application deadline**. Instructions are found on the [form](#).
- Provide a copy of Missouri EMT license with your application. OTC does offer EMT basic. Click [here](#) for additional information.

NOTIFICATION OF ACCEPTANCE:

- ✓ Based upon the program's admission scoring system, the accepted applicants are offered a position in the program and will receive information on the necessary steps to complete their program admission.
- ✓ Letters are mailed out to the address on the application, by USPS shortly after the deadline, indicating acceptance or non-acceptance into the program.
- ✓ The accepted students will receive an acceptance packet email through their OTC email account to complete the admission process.

REAPPLICATION:

- ✓ Applicants and alternates not selected for admission must notify the Allied Health Office, if they wish to pursue admission into the program the following application cycle.
- ✓ Applications must be renewed annually.
- ✓ Inactive application files will be shredded after 12 months.
