**EXCEPTIONS:** Contact Allied Health Admissions (alliedhealthadmissions@otc.edu) if any of these apply:

- ✓ If you have taken BCS 120, BCS 145, BCS 146, or MTH 110 prior to the FA 18 semester.
- ✓ All BCS and CHM course(s) were completed more than 5 years ago.
- ✓ If a passing grade is not achieved after two attempts in any program preadmission requirement, an applicant may not be considered for the program. - ✓ If a 6 hour anatomy & physiology course has been taken at an accredited institution other than OTC and it has been taken within the last 5 years (based on final review of official transcript and in accordance with specific transfer credit), BCS 205 would be required to complete the 8 credit hour A&P progression

#### **IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT PREADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:**

- Application Deadline: February 15
- Mid-term grades will be used if completing preadmission requirements in the spring semester.
- A grade of "C" or higher and a GPA of 2.5 or greater is required in all preadmission courses as part of the selection process.
- All preadmission requirements must be completed or be in the process of completing in the semester you apply to the program (spring semester) for points.
- The student may be completing general education requirements in the summer but will not receive points in the interview selection process.
- Student will not be considered if science requirements are not completed by the end of the spring semester in which student is applying.

### PHLEBOTOMY COURSE INFORMATION

\*The Phlebotomy course may be taken in two ways.

#### Option One is open to both MLT and non-MLT students:

- #1 PLB 100 Introduction to Phlebotomy Spring semester, A block
  - PLB 101 Phlebotomy Clinical Spring semester, B block\*

#### Option Two is only available for students accepted into the MLT program:

- > #2 PLB 100 Introduction to Phlebotomy Spring semester, B block
  - PLB 101 Phlebotomy Clinical Summer semester\*\*

PLB 101 is the clinical portion of the course that is required for the ASCP phlebotomy certification exam and entails practice of phlebotomy skills at a clinical facility for a total of 100 hours. This requires four or more hours of availability at least twice a week. PLB 101 is offered during the second block of the spring semester and the summer semester. Phlebotomy is a pre-requisite for the MLT program.
