

Articulation Agreement between

Southwest Baptist University and Ozarks Technical Community College

This Agreement is entered into between **Ozarks Technical Community College** (hereinafter sending institution), and **Southwest Baptist University** (hereinafter receiving institution). This Agreement and any amendments and supplements, shall be interpreted pursuant to the laws of the State of Missouri.

The sending institution has established *an Associate of Arts in Business* hereinafter sending program), and the receiving institution has established a *Bachelor of Science in business-related field* (hereinafter receiving program), and will facilitate credit transfer and provide a smooth transition from one related program to another. It is mutually agreed:

Admission Requirements

- A. The receiving institution's admission and program admission requirements apply to both direct entry students and to students who transfer under this agreement.
- B. The student must meet admission requirements that exist at the time of application in order to obtain entry to the receiving institution (which may or may not be different from those in place at the time of this agreement.)

Transfer of Credits

- A. The receiving institution will accept a minimum of 60 credits from the sending program. A minimum of 68 total credits remain to complete the receiving program.
- B. The student must complete an Associate's degree with the sending institution, in order for this agreement to be utilized.
- C. Courses will transfer as described in the attached Program Articulation Table.

Implementation and Review

- A. The Chief Academic Officers or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of this agreement, including identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, assuring compliance with system policy, procedure and guidelines, and conducting a periodic review of this agreement.
- B. This Articulation Agreement is effective on *June 1, 2021* and shall remain in effect until the end date of *June 1, 2026* unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice.
- C. The college and university shall work with students to resolve the transfer of courses should changes to either program occur while the agreement is in effect.
- D. This Articulation Agreement will be reviewed by both parties beginning *December 1, 2025*.
- E. When a student notifies the receiving institution of their intent to follow this agreement, the receiving institution will encode course waivers and substitutions.




****The Bachelor of Science degree in General Business requires completion of a modified "Business Core Curriculum" (39 hours – students do not take BUS 1193 or CIS 3123) and an additional 15 hours of business courses, as well as all general education and graduation requirements for the Bachelor of Science degree.**

*****Students need 128 total credit hours to graduate with a B.S. degree from SBU; therefore, depending on the total number of credit hours from OTC and SBU, students may need to take elective hours to meet the 128 credit hour requirement.**

******Students need 40 upper-level credit hours to graduate with a B.S. degree from SBU. Based on the plan provided in this agreement, students majoring in General Business will need an additional 4 upper-level credits.**
