

# **Articulation Agreement between Southwest Baptist University and Ozarks Technical Community College**

This Agreement is entered into between **Ozarks Technical Community College** (hereinafter sending institution), and **Southwest Baptist University** (hereinafter receiving institution). This Agreement and any amendments and supplements, shall be interpreted pursuant to the laws of the State of Missouri.

The sending institution has established an **Associate of Arts in Teaching** program (hereinafter sending program), and the receiving institution has established a **Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education** program (hereinafter receiving program), and will facilitate credit transfer and provide a smooth transition from one related program to another. It is mutually agreed:

## **Admission Requirements**

- A. The receiving institution's admission and program admission requirements apply to both direct entry students and to students who transfer under this agreement.
- B. The student must meet admission requirements that exist at the time of application in order to obtain entry to the receiving institution (which may or may not be different from those in place at the time of this agreement).

## **Transfer of Credits**

- A. The receiving institution will accept 65 credits from the sending program. A total of 64 credits remain to complete the receiving program, as SBU requires a minimum of 128 hours for graduation.
- B. The student must complete an Associate's degree with the sending institution, in order for this agreement to be utilized.
- C. Courses will transfer as described in the attached Program Articulation Table.

## **Implementation and Review**

- A. The Chief Academic Officers or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of this agreement, including identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, assuring compliance with system policy, procedure and guidelines, and conducting a periodic review of this agreement.
- B. This Articulation Agreement is effective on 05/01/2021 and shall remain in effect until the end date of 05/01/2026 unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice.
- C. The college and university shall work with students to resolve the transfer of courses should changes to either program occur while the agreement is in effect.
- D. This Articulation Agreement will be reviewed by both parties beginning 10/01/2025.
- E. When a student notifies the receiving institution of their intent to follow this agreement, the receiving institution will encode course waivers and substitutions.
