APPLICATION DEADLINE:

- April 1 Classes begin in the fall
- October 15 Classes begin in the spring

¹The Radiography Program is a selective admission program, and admission is determined by a points-based system. To see how points are determined, refer to the <u>Candidate Selection Form</u>. A 2.75 GPA is required to be eligible for this program. An incomplete file will not be considered. Complete the following by the application deadline:

- Complete the OTC admissions process.
- Preadmission courses must be completed or in progress by the application deadline. Student must email <u>healthsciences@otc.edu</u> if:
 - o a passing grade of "C" or better is not achieved after two attempts in any program preadmission requirement, **OR**
 - o your anatomy and physiology sequence will be more than 5 years old at the time of your application deadline.
- Official transcripts from accredited schools attended other than OTC must be received by OTC
 Admissions before the application deadline (preferably 4-6 weeks prior to allow time for review).
- Submit a Radiography application using the online application portal <u>apply.otc.edu</u> by the application deadline (preferably 4 weeks prior to the deadline).
- Provide 1 personal and 1 professional reference during the online application process by the deadline. A professional reference should be able to comment on academic potential, work performance or potential to function in a health care field.
- Complete a minimum of 4 hours of job shadowing **prior to applying for the program**. For more information about shadowing, access the <u>Job Shadowing Experience Form</u>, which should be uploaded during the online application process **by the application deadline**.
- Complete TOEFL testing if English is not student's native language and upload results during the online application process by the application deadline.

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENT:

Students whose first language is not English must document their English language proficiency. This requires:

- Minimum TOEFL iBT passing score of 81, with a minimum speaking score of 24. *Program will waive TOEFL requirement if the student has already obtained a bachelor's degree from a US regionally accredited University*
- Student must satisfy this requirement by submitting a current TOEFL iBT score (Test of English as a Foreign Language) during the online application process by the application deadline.
- Testing is completed through the TOEFL website.
- The TOEFL report scores are valid for 5 years from the test date.
- This is separate from the test taken to be admitted to OTC.

¹SELECTION FOR INTERVIEW PROCESS:

Using the <u>Candidate Selection Form</u>, top-scoring applicants will receive an interview.

- All preadmission courses must be completed by the end of the semester in which the applicant is applying.
- Mid-term grades will be checked in the semester students are applying.
- A total GPA of 2.75 and higher, as well as a grade of C or higher in all pre-requisite coursework is required to be considered a viable candidate.

INTERVIEW PROCESS:

- A message regarding the date, time, and location of the interview will be sent to your OTC email if you are selected.
- The interview is approximately one hour in length.

NOTIFICATION OF ACCEPTANCE:

- Based upon the program's admission scoring system, the 20 applicants with the highest score will be
 offered a position in the program and will receive information on the necessary steps to complete the
 program admissions.
- Information regarding acceptance or non-acceptance into the program will be delivered to students via the online application portal.
- The accepted students will receive an acceptance packet task list through their OTC email account to complete the admission process.

REAPPLICATION:

- ✓ Applicants not selected for admission can reapply online for the next deadline.
